

The visual material of this presentation has the mode of an art exhibition. I juxtapose images of my studio practice with students' photographs and video stills and artifacts. The photographs, video stills, and classroom artifacts have been created during an action research that is focused on place. The paired images aim to raise questions about my practice as a creative practitioner both in my studio and in the art classroom. By using vintage artifacts ("pedagogic artifacts," as they called them during the 1980s) for collage, I would like to pinpoint my school age and how creative activities of that time defined me as a creative practitioner. The rationale concerns questioning the norms of a community. In particular, I question those norms that have been defined by education and creative learning. As a whole, with an implied a/r/tography role, I argue that artistic research and art-based research may interrogate and extend the creative potential of participants.










